Coronavirus update

The Covid-19 pandemic continues to have a huge impact on our daily lives and the colder winter months are seeing a second wave of infections.

In Scotland, on 23 October, the government announced a new system of 5 Protection Levels.

Stopping the spread starts with all of us

These Covid Protection Levels set out measures that can be applied nationally or locally depending on prevalence of the virus across the country.

The 5-level system came into force on 2 November. Each Local Authority area in Scotland has been placed within a level and the Government intends to keep these levels under review and announce any changes on a weekly basis.

If you are uncertain of what level your local area is in, you can find out via the postcode checker on the Scottish Government website: https://www.gov.scot/check-local-covidlevel/ or you can speak to your manager or a member of our staff.

Hanover of course must observe these levels and over time these may go up

or down, depending on the extent of infection. We are responding to this by adapting our services to reflect the different Scottish Government levels to ensure that we operate, as a minimum, within the regulations.

We are also continuing to offer extra support to any resident who is experiencing social isolation or simply wants to hear a friendly voice. You can enjoy support from our telephone buddies scheme and if you are interested please call us on 0800 111 4646.
